

## Escape Fast

Well, if you happen to run into that problem and want a quick way out, try the **Escape (Esc)** key on your keyboard. It's located in the very top left hand corner and it'll get you out of sitting and waiting for a Web page to load up. Pressing the Esc key will automatically stop the browser's action and you can try another site or try the same page over again.

Picasa Web Albums program is the fast and easy way to put your photos online so you can start sharing.

Use it with the Picasa software to upload entire albums of high quality photos in a click of the software's "Web Album" button, or use your normal web browser to add pictures.

Each account gets 1GB (and counting!) of free storage - that's enough to post and share around 4,000 standard resolution photos.

Best of all, you and your friends can download your photos at the same high quality to print and enjoy.

Nan is an excellent example of what can be done, even at an age when most of us are retiring— a great example for us all. It is an honour to have her in our club.


She can always be relied on for help and advice. When we are not sure about something, she is always there to help out.

## A Fast, Free and Effective Way To Live Virtually Spam Free.

Windows (all versions). Requires a free Gmail account.

This tip is for all of you who have Gmail accounts - and who access their Gmail account with their email program. (If you don't have a Gmail account, you can get one free at [www.gmail.com](http://www.gmail.com) . To set it up in your email program, read Google Gmail's excellent setup instructions). Most all of you with Gmail accounts who check your Gmail account with your email program, also have at least one ISP account too. Did you know that you can access these accounts via your Gmail account?

If you're plagued with spam and you're looking for a cheap way to avoid it without using some goofy free spam filter, you can use Gmail's excellent spam filtering for any other email accounts you have as long as they are POP3 accounts (Hotmail and Yahoo Mail are not POP3). Your ISP provides you with at least one POP3 account -most ISP's provide you with at least 5.

So how do you add your ISPs email account to your Gmail account? Very easily. Login to your Gmail account, click "Settings" and then click "Add another email account".

**This Web site offers a bundle of programs** called a suite, which includes a word processor, an e-mail program, a password utility, a calendar and even a Sudoku game. If you don't want all of the programs, you can install them individually. There are dozens of portable applications to choose from.

Here's a quick note about installing the applications: make sure you have your flash drive plugged in when you download the apps. After you start the installer, it will ask you where you want to install them. To do it correctly, choose the drive letter of your flash drive and then continue on with the installation. Enjoy! <http://portableapps.com/apps>

### What is a portable app?

**portable** - carried or moved with ease

**app** - a computer program like a web browser or word processor

A portable app is a computer program that you can carry around with you on a portable device and use on any Windows computer. When your USB flash drive, portable hard drive, iPod or other portable device is plugged in, you have access to your software and personal data just as you would on your own PC. And when you unplug the device, none of your personal data is left behind.

**No Special Hardware:** Use any USB flash drive, portable hard drive, iPod/MP3player etc.

**No Additional Software:** Just download the portable app, run the portable installer and go.
